

The Church of St Thomas's Salisbury

The church itself dates from the 13th Century, was dedicated to St Thomas a Becket around 1220 and is first mentioned in annals in 1238. The history of Salisbury is reflected within its walls, with ancient glass and embroidery, medieval polychrome ceilings and what is reputed to be the largest wall painting of the last judgement still surviving, The "Doom", dating from around 1475.

Tudor Arms, carvings and brasswork, Georgian woodwork and wrought iron and the Organ and case originally given to the Cathedral by George III in 1792 and made by Samuel Green, all demonstrate the changes made to the building over the years.

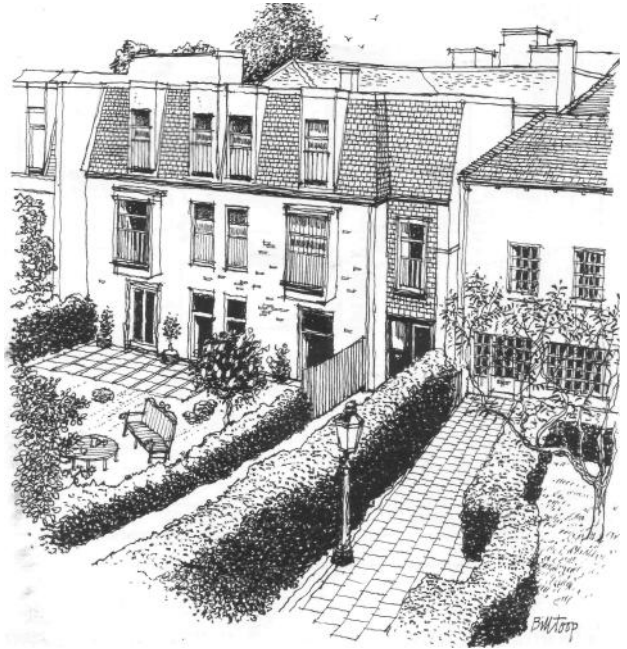
The Tower was completed in 1400 and stands over 90 feet above ground level. There are 131 steps to the top, which gives a wonderful panoramic view of the City. The interior of the tower houses the bell chamber, containing the eight 18th Century bells. The Church Clock on the east face of the tower has special 16th Century bells, which are struck on the quarter hour by the restored Tudor quarter jacks.

During the late 19th Century the East End was redesigned and the magnificent Apostles Window installed, the Lady Chapel was restored and the "Doom" cleaned of whitewash. This turned St Thomas's into a delightful and inspiring church, still nurtured by today's members.

Proud as we are, the church is not a museum but is the place of worship for a large and lively congregation of all ages and is the Civic Church of the City, used for official services by the Mayor and Charter Trustees.

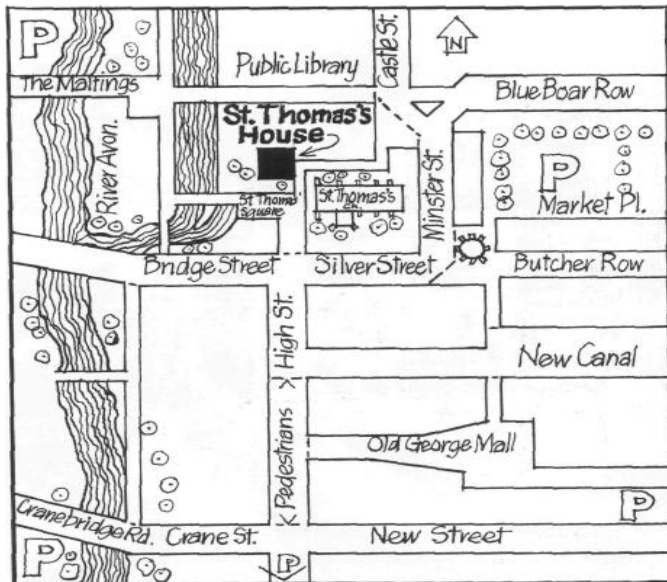
