Dearly beloved,
the Scripture moveth us in sundry places to acknowledge
and confess our manifold sins and wickedness;
and that we should not dissemble nor cloak them
before the face of almighty God our heavenly Father;
but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient
heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by
his infinite goodness and mercy.

And although we ought at all times humbly to acknowledge
our sins before God; yet ought we most chiefly so to do, when we
assemble and meet together

to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received
at his hands,

to set forth his most worthy praise,

to hear his most holy word,

and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary,
as well for the body as the soul.

Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present,
to accompany me with a pure heart, and humble voice, unto the
throne of the heavenly grace, saying with me:

Beloved, we are come together in the presence of almighty God
and of the whole company of heaven to offer unto him through
our Lord Jesus Christ our worship and praise and thanksgiving; to
make confession of our sins; to pray, as well for others as for
ourselves, that we may know more truly the greatness of God's
love and shew forth in our lives the fruits of his grace; and to ask
on behalf of all people such things as their well-being doth
require.

Wherefore let us kneel in silence, and remember God's presence
with us now.
