**Vacancies for Governors at Wyvern College:** Wyvern College is a voluntary aided Cof E school. Churches Together in Salisbury acts in the capacity of the PCC making recommendations for the appointment of Foundation Governors. Currently there are vacancies for 5 foundation governors. 3 of these need to be Anglican and 2 from other member churches.
